# National Youth Theatre of Great Britain X HKYAF X ArtisTree Jointly Present "FLOOD"

Original Theatre Experience on Water with Hong Kong's Top 22 Young Performers In Collaboration with Internationally Acclaimed Theatre Makers

## A Contemporary Saga of Survival and Salvation



**[27 July 2018, Hong Kong]** This September, 22 of Hong Kong's top young talents star in the world premiere of an original theatre performance – *FLOOD* – a brand new piece written by award-winning British playwright **Rory Mullarkey**. A co-production with National Youth Theatre of Great Britain (NYT), Hong Kong Youth Arts Foundation (HKYAF) and Taikoo Place's ArtisTree, *FLOOD* brings together an internationally renowned team to create a breath-taking piece of theatre filled with action-packed suspense and heartfelt raw emotions.

"ArtisTree is designed as a platform for innovative and thought-provoking productions, and this new theatrical work will engage audience with striking set design and features and a unique narrative about environment issues," **Babby Fung, Head of Office Marketing of Swire Properties** said, 'With the participation of the young and talented actors recruited by the world's famous NYT and our long-term partner HKYAF, we are looking forward to presenting this intriguing and experiential production in September this year."

HKYAF and ArtisTree are delighted to be collaborating with NYT on this bold and beautiful production. Being the world's first youth theatre company, NYT has fostered the careers of many British actors, including Dame Helen Mirren, Daniel Craig, Sir Daniel Day-Lewis, Colin Firth, Rosamund Pike, Orlando Bloom and Chiwetel Ejiofor CBE, and musician Ed Sheeran.

Last summer, the creative team selected a cast of 22 talented young multinational performers aged 13 to 21 in Hong Kong, bringing *FLOOD* to life through diverse theatrical features, including choral speaking, physical components and digital imagery. Taking inspiration from flooding as a major global issue around the world, the performance is written in the style of







eloquent contemporary verse that explores the consequences of flooding and salvaging hope in the midst of despair.

**Rory Mullarkey** (Writer) was the youngest writer to have his work performed at the Royal Exchange Theatre's main stage at the age of 25. Having studied Russian at Cambridge University, he has expanded his scope of work writing original plays, translating Russian and Ukrainian drama texts, along with writing libretti for the Royal Opera House and Garsington Opera.

His inspiration for *FLOOD* came from his love for cities by the sea:

"They sit there, solid as facts, filled with all the delicate and complicated and magnificent things people can make, perched on the edge of nature's simplest abyss. It's amazing how fragile they are. What if the water just... rose?"

Taking the theme of flooding further, Mullarkey looked at ancient Greek dramas and wrote *FLOOD* in a "direct, language-led" manner that includes a choral-structure that echoes choruses from ancient Greek tragedies. Captivated by age-old questions that these ancient dramas tried to answer, he poses the same questions in *FLOOD*:

"...if we lost everything we hold dear – our homes, our possessions, our families, our friends – then who would we be? And what would we become?"

## **Designing with Water**

Surpassing conventional theatre traditions, *FLOOD* also pushes the boundaries of theatre-making by incorporating an innovative set design and striking digital images with real water on stage! In creating the right atmosphere to convey the story, **Joel Scott** (Director) and **Alex Lowde** (Designer) were inspired by numerous water imagery, including images of the flood from the biblical story of Noah's Ark. The result is an ambitious design feat by flooding the theatre space at ArtisTree with an extensive pool of water, alongside a movable mountainous structure in the middle of the pool and digital projection of continually shifting imagery designed by **Dick Straker** (Projection Designer).

Together with Mullarkey's impassioned writing and Lowde's remarkable watery design, **Neil Callaghan** (Movement Director) further complements the script by choreographing articulate movement sequences with the Hong Kong cast. He focuses on ensemble work by developing a movement language to deliver the complex emotions throughout the performance, letting the body speak when words fail to describe.

## **Towards the Flood and Beyond**

The production of *FLOOD* marks the first collaboration between HKYAF and NYT. Both organisations are passionate about providing young people with high-quality creative opportunities and access to working with top artists worldwide. *FLOOD* provides a unique occasion for the young cast to work with some of the world's leading artists on a professional production. At the same time, the cast will gain valuable life skills that will boost their confidence in teamwork, communicating effectively and taking ownership of their achievements.

**Paul Roseby OBE**, CEO and Artistic Director of NYT said "It is a privilege for us here at the National Youth Theatre of Great Britain to be staging work in Hong Kong for the first time and we hope this project will lead to further ambitious collaborations, international friendships and shared creative and educational learning between our two organisations."
